

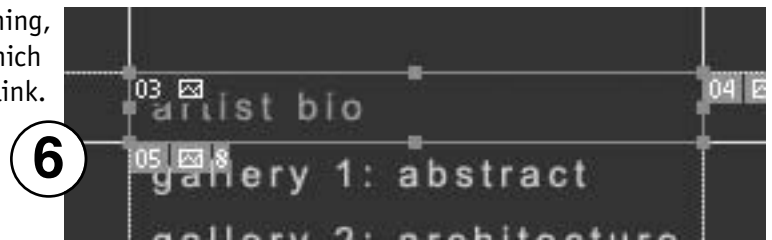
## ART2030 - Computers in Art

### Project III - Creating Slices in Photoshop for Dreamweaver

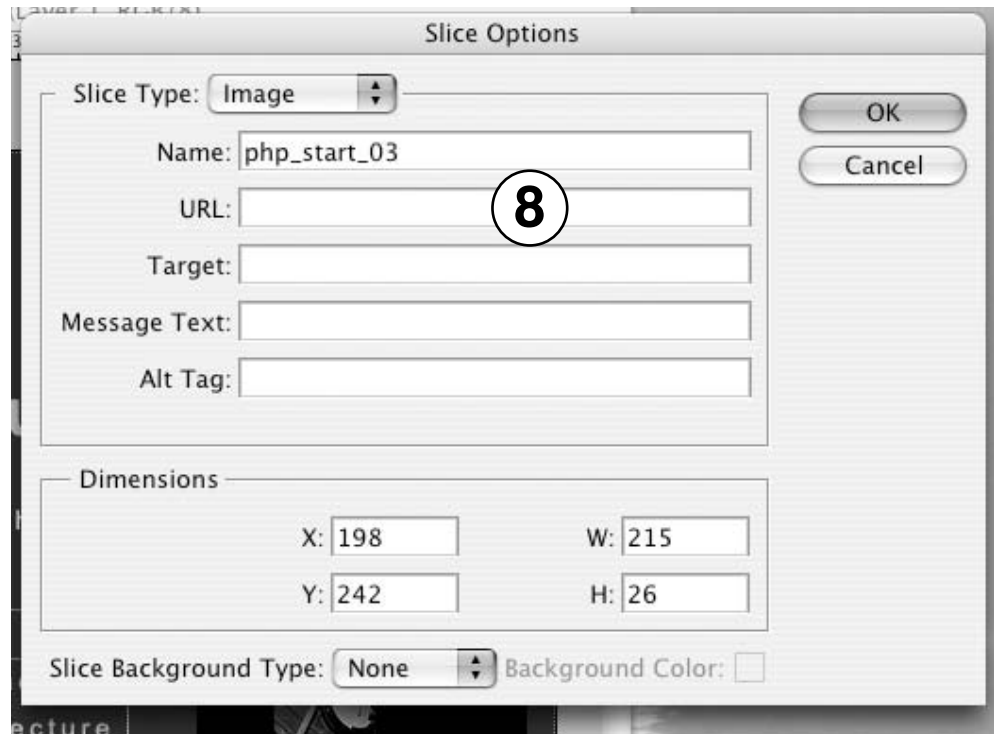
1. Open your completed web page in Photoshop.
2. Flatten image. (optional)
3. Show rulers.
4. Drag guides from rulers to indicate areas which will be designated as active links or "buttons".



5. Choose the **Slice Tool** from the main tool bar.
6. Using the guidelines for positioning, click and drag over each area which will be designated as an active link.



7. Right click on a 'sliced' area and select "Edit Slice Options" from the pop-out menu.
8. Set the **URL** for the slice, and an Alt Tag, if desired. All other fields can remain blank. Click 'OK'. Repeat 7 and 8 for all slices which will be active links.



- After **ALL** slices have been configured, use **“Save As”** to save a copy of your file with the slices intact. Save as a .PSD file. **(NOTE: This step is entirely optional.)**
- Choose **“Save for Web...”** from the ‘File’ pull-down menu. This will open Photoshop’s ImageReady program on top of your existing Photoshop document.



- Click and drag to marquee the entire image to ensure **all** slices are selected/highlighted. (Note: If an area/slice is **dim**, then it is **NOT** selected.)
- In the file-saving options area (upper right), set parameters to ‘JPEG High’ and check ‘Optimized’.
- Click **“Save”** to proceed with saving your sliced Photoshop file for use in Dreamweaver.
- IMPORTANT!** - You’ll save your start page with the filename **“index.html”**, with the Format set to **“HTML and Images”**. Make sure you save to your website folder in your student folder! The resulting **“index.html”** file can be opened in Dreamweaver.
